How can I protect myself from financial scams?

Fraudsters are using increasingly **sophisticated** methods to try to gain access to **your money and personal data**.

These methods include fake websites, social media, and bogus calls and texts.

A fraudster might try to persuade you to buy a financial product or invest your money.

Or they might promise you a loan or encourage you to purchase a cheap - but fake - insurance policy.

If you receive a phone call, email or text **unexpectedly**, take the **SAFE** test.

S - Stop

Stop, think and ask yourself:

What is this firm offering? Who is contacting me? Where did they get my contact details?

A - Assess

Assess the information you are being given and check **Central Bank of Ireland's online registers** to see if the firm is authorised.

Even if the firm **appears to be authorised**, make sure it is genuine and hasn't just **copied the details of a real firm**.

F - Fact-check

Fact-check the offer. **Never provide your personal information** or agree to send money unless you are sure **the firm is authorised and genuine.**

E – Expose and report

Expose fraudsters by reporting them to us.

We have powers to investigate and take action against fraudsters.

And remember – the Central Bank will never contact you asking for money, your personal data or your PPS number.
