How was Central Bank of Ireland socially responsible in 2021?

1. Urban bees

We established two new beehive colonies at our Dockland Campus in Dublin.

The hives are home to approximately 10,000 bees that will begin supplying honey in May 2022.

2. Single-use plastics

We eliminated an estimated 900kgs of **single-use plastic waste** by switching to sustainable materials in our coin operations.

3. Helping the homeless

We helped to deliver **food parcels** to the homeless community in our local area, **benefitting up to 100 people a night** over the winter months.

4. Diversity & Inclusion

We launched a new **Gender Identity and Expression in the Workplace policy** to provide **guidance and support** to people who wish to transition or affirm their **gender in the workplace**.

In 2021 we **provided training to over 300 of our people** to enable them to play their part as supportive allies.

5. Supporting young people

We continued to **support young people** in our local community through a range of education skills and workplace initiatives.

These included **scholarships**, **internships** and **work experience** programmes.
